After the internship was complete, Fr. Paul was invited to stay on at the hospital for an additional six years working with various groups.

"Boston is where I became a true priest," he reflected.

After 19 years in Boston, Fr. Paul headed west to become associate pastor of St. Paul the Apostle Church in Los Angeles, where he served through 2009. While there, he collaborated on the establishment of the St. Paul the Apostle Counseling and Education Center.

From 2009 to 2012, Fr. Paul was again in Toronto for his second stint serving at the Information Center and at St. Peter's Church.

In September 2012, Fr. Paul entered senior ministry status in Los Angeles, residing with the other Paulist Fathers in the rectory at St. Paul the Apostle, where he was honored with a special anniversary Mass and celebration on May 8.

In a message to the people of the parish, Fr. Paul wrote, "I wish to thank all of you for your support and friendship. We move on now in a new Church. As Pope Francis said, it's a Church of mercy, love and healing. I'm proud to be a Paulist with the other Paulists and, of course, all of you."

60 Years of Service

May 3, 1956, was an incredibly important day in the history of the Paulist Fathers. On that day, at the Church of St. Paul the Apostle in New York City, 17 men were ordained by Cardinal Francis Spellman, archbishop of New York. It was the largest ordination class in the history of our community.

This month, five of those men will celebrate the 60th anniversary of their priestly ministry:

Rev. William Joseph Cantwell, C.S.P.

Fr. Bill, 89, has served in New York City; Layton, UT; Minneapolis; Morgantown, WV; Plateau, AL; Greeley, CO; Knoxville, TN; Memphis, TN; and Vero Beach, FL.

Rev. Kevin Aloysius Devine, C.S.P.

Fr. Kevin, 85, was a U.S. Army chaplain. From 1962 to 1993, his service as a chaplain took him to various points around the world. He served at our parishes in Boston and New York City and provided pastoral care for pilgrims in Medjugorje, Bosnia-Herzegovina.

Rev. Joseph Francis Mahon, C.S.P.

Fr. Joe, 87, has served in Chicago; Portland; New York City; and South Bend, IN. He spent many years as a missions preacher.

Rev. James Francis McQuade, C.S.P.

Fr. James, 86, has served in New York City; Grand Rapids, MI; Austin, TX; Morgantown, WV; Greeley, CO; Toronto, ON and Knoxville, TN. He spent many years as a hospital chaplain.

Rev. David William O'Brien, C.S.P.

Fr. David, 88, has served in Austin, TX; Storrs, CT; Santa Barbara, CA; Boston; Berkeley, CA; and Columbus, OH. He also served as the Paulist Fathers' vice president and first consultor.







