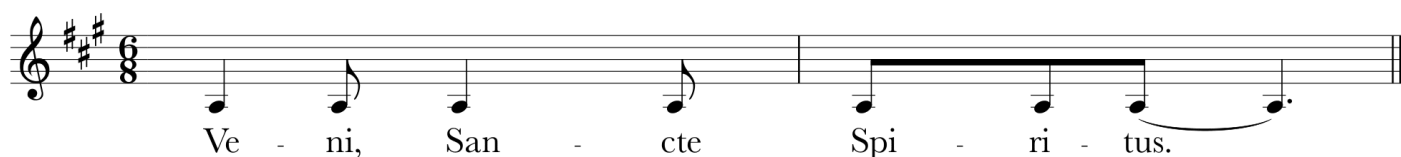





Bishop Richard G. Henning

On June 8, 2018, Archbishop Christophe Pierre, Apostolic Nuncio to the United States announced that Pope Francis had appointed Rev. Msgr. Richard Garth Henning to be an auxiliary bishop of the Diocese of Rockville Centre. On July 24, 2018 in St. Agnes Cathedral, Rockville Centre, New York, Most Reverend John O. Barres, Bishop, Diocese of Rockville Centre ordained Bishop-Elect Henning an auxiliary bishop of the Diocese of Rockville Centre. Most Reverend William Murphy, Bishop-Emeritus, Diocese of Rockville Centre and Most Reverend Robert Brennan, Vicar General, Diocese of Rockville Centre and Auxiliary Bishop were co-consecrators.

Bishop Henning was born in Rockville Centre, New York in 1964 to Richard and Maureen Henning, the first of five siblings. He grew up in Valley Stream receiving the sacraments of baptism, first Holy Communion, and confirmation at Holy Name of Mary Parish, where he also attended the parish grammar school. In the summers, Bishop Henning spent a good deal of time on a small island in the Great South Bay where his family has gone for generations. There, he developed a lifelong passion for the water, sailing, boating, and kayaking on the bay.

Bishop Henning attended Chaminade High School in Mineola, New York and counts the Marianists as a major influence in his faith life and commitment to learning. He received a BA and MA in History from St. John's University, Queens New York and received his training for the priesthood at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington New York. He was ordained in 1992 and served for five years as an associate pastor at the Church of St. Peter of Alcantara, Port Washington. In that assignment, he did extensive pastoral work in the large parish school and ministered to the Spanish-speaking Catholics of that peninsula. In addition to fluency in English and Spanish, Bishop Henning is fluent in Italian and is able to read French, Greek and Hebrew.

In 1997, Bishop McGann assigned then Father Henning to post-graduate studies in Sacred Scripture. He earned a Licentiate in Biblical Theology at The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. and a Doctorate in the same from the University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome, Italy.

After his studies, Bishop Henning joined the faculty of the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington, where he taught scripture for more than ten years. At that same time, he began assisting on the weekends at St. Patrick's Parish in Bay Shore and later added pastoral work at the Catholic Mission, Our Lady of the Magnificat in Ocean Beach on Fire Island.

In 2012, as part of the partnership for seminary formation among the Dioceses of Rockville Centre, Brooklyn, and the Archdiocese of New York, then Rev. Msgr. Henning was appointed to lead the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception through its transition to the largest retreat house in the Northeast. The Ordinaries of Rockville Centre, Brooklyn and New York also charged him to establish and lead the Sacred Heart Institute for the ongoing formation of Catholic priests and deacons. Bishop Henning is also noted for his work with international priests serving in the U.S.

Bishop Barres appointed Bishop Henning the interim Episcopal Vicar for the Central Vicariate of the Diocese of Rockville Centre in September of 2017. Since that appointment, he has worked closely with Bishop Barres on projects related to parish evangelization and in Bishop Barres' call to dramatic missionary growth. On June 29, 2018, Bishop Barres appointed Bishop Henning to lead a new office to help drive dramatic missionary growth in the Diocese of Rockville Centre. Bishop Henning will serve as Vicar for Parish Evangelization and Pastoral Planning.



Father Michael Cruickshank, C.S.P.

Father Mike Cruickshank, CSP was born in Chelmsford, MA on January 11, 1982 as the youngest of four boys. He attended public schools there and after graduating from high school in 2000, he went to Washington University in St. Louis. After earning a degree in Computer Science, he moved to New York City to work for the financial services company Citigroup.

It was in New York that he first met the Paulist Fathers at the Church of Saint Paul the Apostle. He became involved in the church's young adult ministry Apostolist, which allowed him to discern a life in service of the Church and God's people. After fruitful discernment, he entered the Paulist Novitiate in 2013. He went on to make his Final Promise to the Paulists on September 4, 2020 and was ordained a deacon one day later. Since earning his theology degree from Catholic University of America in December 2020, he has been serving as a deacon at the Cathedral of Saint Andrew in Grand Rapids, MI.

Mike has many people to thank for making a positive impact on his faith life and supporting him along his journey toward priesthood. First and foremost, he thanks his mother and father. And his grandparents, who were foundational in how he understands a Christian way of life. He also deeply cherishes the love he shares with his three brothers and sisters-in-law, and his seven nieces and nephews. As well, this journey would not have been possible without the support of his many aunts, uncles, and cousins. He has many friends to thank as well, who are too many to mention here, but come from many aspects of his life - childhood, high school, college, work life, church community, and beyond. Finally, he would like to thank certain individuals who kept him close to the Church at different times in his life and also guided him to his Paulist vocation. They are Vivien McLachlan, Annette Twells, Julie Roust, Fr. Gil Martinez, and Fr. Mark-David Janus. For all the people who have influenced his life, Mike gives great thanks.



Father Richard Whitney, C.S.P.

Born in Massachusetts but raised in a Navy family in places like Japan, Florida, and Virginia, Rich Whitney started his professional life as a stage actor but quickly discovered that work was steadier backstage and so spent the next fifteen years building scenery, lighting stages, managing productions and even touring a bit. He worked primarily in the Washington DC area at such places as the Shakespeare Theater, Arena Stage, Catholic University, the Folger Shakespeare Library, and the Smithsonian Institution.

Shortly after 2000, Rich moved to Boston, where his family lived, and attended Northeastern University, graduating with degrees in history around 2006. The challenges of transitioning to an academic career led to another career change, this time to addictions counseling. Further training in pastoral counseling, geriatric and end of life care, and mental health counseling really ignited a desire to serve the Church as a permanent deacon. After nearly two years of prayerful discernment, though, Rich realized the call to the priesthood and entered the Paulist Fathers seminary in Washington, DC in 2015, making his first promise to the Paulist Fathers in 2016 and being ordained to the Diaconate in 2020.

Rich is the oldest of three children to Dick and Debby Whitney. He would like to thank his family for their constant love and support over the past and in the years to come, especially his parents and brother and sister. Many thanks go out to the uncles, aunts, and cousins who have been such a major part of life and love. Many others have influenced and guided him on this current path, too many to name individually, but a few of the most important include Sr. Nancy Kehoe, Carol Menkiti, Mary Alice and Vincent Stanton, Fr.
