During these dog days of summer, many things are bittersweet, especially in this final year of my eight years as president of the Paulist Fathers.

This role has been a blessing – with times that have filled me with great hope: Having a great seat at Ordination Masses; accepting the promises of our seminarians, novices, Paulist Associates and Paulist Deacon Affiliates; and taking part in celebrations at the parishes and centers that we serve.

The position also comes with natural worries, of course, that I will not mind passing along to my successor. And, as is the case for many, COVID-19 has worn me down somewhat.

But those worries and the virus were no match for the joy of this year's Ordination Mass on May 22 at which Paulists Richard Whitney and Mike Cruickshank became priests.

I loved being part of the formation of these two great Paulists. They brought a wealth of professional and lived experience with them to the seminary. And that life experience proved invaluable many times, including when our seminarians moved from our former seminary building to our temporary home at St. Joseph's Seminary – and later as they both dealt with bouts of COVID.

I also have been heartened by the generous response to our comprehensive fundraising campaign, "Hope for the Future," which at this writing is poised to meet the \$20 million mark.

# **Unique Vocation Journeys: ORDINATION**

## **MASS 2021**

Surrounded by family members, friends and brother Paulists. Paulist Deacon Michael Cruickshank and Paulist Deacon Richard Whitney were ordained priests during an 11 a.m. Mass on Saturday, May 22, 2021, at our mother church, the Church of St. Paul the Apostle in New York City.

The ordaining bishop was Bishop Richard G. Henning, who became an auxiliary bishop of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, NY, in 2018.

"As you both know, this is the first time I will ordain anybody," Bishop Henning said to the ordinands. "So, I was deeply moved to hear the stories of your vocation, of your call. Each of you has a kind of long journey that has brought you to this moment and a very unique one."

A native of Chelmsford, MA, Fr. Mike earned his undergraduate degree in computer science at Washington University in St. Louis, MO. After college, he moved to New York City to work for Citigroup. It was then that he met the Paulists at the Church of St. Paul the Apostle.

Fr. Rich grew up in Massachusetts and Washington, D.C. After high school, he worked behind the scenes at theaters as a carpenter, technical director, production manager and electrician. After earning his undergraduate degree in history at Northeastern University, he also worked as an addictions counselor. He met the Paulists through the Paulist




Center in Boston.

In June, the Catholic Media Association (formerly the Catholic Press Association) awarded Paulist Fr. Dave **Dwyer the Gabriel Award for Personal Achievement.** 

Fr. Dave is longtime director of the Paulist Fathers' Busted Halo media ministry and host of "The Busted Halo Show" on SiriusXM's The Catholic Channel.

The Gabriel Awards recognize excellence in film, television, radio and digital offerings. In describing the Gabriel Award for Personal Achievement, the Catholic Media Association stated:

"This award goes to the person, who through their life and work, communicates the message of Jesus Christ with integrity and persistence. Their contribution to the media culture offers light amid darkness and hope in the midst of suffering. Through this recognition, colleagues acknowledge the awardee's gifts and talents for proclaiming the Gospel in the world of communications.

"Candidates must be in the field for at least 10 years, made a significant contribution to Catholic communications media and consistently upheld the Church's teachings. including Catholic social teaching."

Paulist Fr. Eric Andrews, our president, said the recognition was well-deserved.

"In 2020, on radio and online, Fr. Dave led so many people throughout the pandemic and other calamities with grace, perseverance, and grit," he said.

In June, the Paulist Fathers also received a Gabriel Award in the religious places category for the Internet video "We Need Each Other - St. Patrick's in a Time of Pandemic." The video describes how St. Patrick's Catholic American Parish in Rome persevered during COVID-19. It was created by freelance filmmaker Emanuele Sesta and produced by the Paulist Office of Marketing and Communications.

Busted Halo also received eight recognitions from Catholic Media Association at this year's Catholic Press awards ceremony. This included a first place award in the best multimedia package category for the feature "Faith in Action: Resources for Today's Anti-Racist Catholic."
