## Celebrating Paulists in Broadcasting Busted Halo's 20th · "Hollywood Priest" · Our Radio Days

This is a season of anniversaries and remembrances for the Paulist Fathers' media ministries.

This autumn, we began celebrating the 20th anniversary of the launch of the Busted Halo website in December, 2001.

Busted Halo began as an online magazine for young adults and spiritual seekers. Its creation was led by Paulist Fr. Frank DeSiano (then president of the Paulists), Brett Hoover, and Mike Hayes.



While never losing that focus on young adults and seekers, the website also has become a leading resource for Catholic educators, youth ministers, young adult ministers and others seeking to explain aspects of our faith.

For the past 15 years, the Busted

Halo ministry also has included "The Busted Halo Show" heard weekday evenings on SiriusXM satellite radio's "The Catholic Channel."

Since 2004, Busted Halo has been led by Paulist Fr. Dave Dwyer. In June, Fr. Dave was awarded the Gabriel Award for Personal Achievement from the Catholic Media Association.

Today, Fr. Dave works with Editor-in-Chief Jen Sawyer. Digital Content Editor Mary Kate Polanin, and Development Associate Kiera Mulhall. They are aided by a talented group of freelance writers.

Also part of the Busted Halo team is **Audrey O'Brien**, who edits content for **Amendo.com**. Amendo is a new lifestyle website for 20-somethings seeking to "reconnect life and spirt."

On "The Busted Halo Show," Fr. Dave is joined on air by Co-Host Brett Siddell and Producer Christina Ambrosino.

Paulist Productions, our creator of films and television programs, also is celebrating its history this autumn with the release of the new documentary "Hollywood Priest: The Story of Fr. 'Bud' Kieser."

The documentary shares the life and times of Paulist Fr. Ellwood Kieser (1929 - 2000). He was the founder of Paulist Productions, its Emmy Award-winning anthology

The radio programs distributed by Paulist Communications included "Sound and Sense" hosted by

Paulist Fr. John Geanev out of WMAL in Washington, D.C., and "Country Roads" hosted by Fr. Joe Breighner on the country music station in Baltimore. At their height, they were heard on more than 350 stations throughout the United States.

A special Mass to celebrate the history of Paulist Communications is being planned.






## **First Promise**
